Editor's Desk

The second issue of the FSI quarterly newsletter 'Videsh Sewa' focuses on the intensive training programme of the Indian Foreign Service (IFS) Officer Trainees (OTs) 2018 batch. The many innovations this year included Protocol deployment at Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (Varanasi) and Kumbh Mela (Prayagraj), Cyber security attachment with Gujarat Forensic Sciences University, stand-alone modules on Customs & Central Excise, S&T diplomacy, Space diplomacy, Crisis Management, Sports diplomacy, Culinary diplomacy, Art appreciation, etc. as integral to the programme. IFS OTs-2018 participated in the Raisina Dialogue. English and Hindi classes were organised on request. Other new elements were sessions with foreign Ambassadors (including P-5 countries), simulation exercise with young US diplomats, interaction with foreign diplomats, country-specific paper writing and book review. The focus was on essential knowledge and high-impact, skill-based, hands-on practical training. In brief, FSI training combined 'sage on stage' with 'guide on side' methodology. The training calendar was refined to ensure timely movement to the Missions for language training.

Further, Defence Attaches-designate to our Missions from all three services, Commercial Representatives from Africa and Americas, Directors/heads of Indian Cultural Centres abroad attended tailor-made programmes at FSI. All India-based personnel in the Missions attended promotion and posting-related training programmes including passport, visa, accounts, etc. modules.

On the training of foreign diplomats, FSI conducted the first thematic programme by way of Disarmament Fellowship extended to one diplomat each from 26 developing and developed countries. The huge success of the Programme led to its institutionalisation as an annual event in the FSI calendar. The first half of 2019 also saw enhanced participation of foreign diplomats by way of our flagship 67th Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats (PCFD), new regional course for diplomats from five Central Asian countries, and country-specific special courses for Syria, Sudan, Morocco, Senegal, Angola, Botswana, Equatorial Guinea, Liberia, Sao Tome & Principe, Egypt and Maldives. The familiarisation programme for resident Heads of Missions from Africa, following the success of the programme for Grulac Ambassadors last year, was a notable achievement. In comparison to 2017, the foreign training courses doubled in 2018 and are on course to be tripled during 2019.

All in all, the first half of 2019 was noteworthy for the increasing number of courses, enlarged scope of coverage, revised methodology of training, introduction of new modules and infrastructure improvement at FSI.

TRAINING FOR IFS OFFICER TRAINEES/ INDIAN DIPLOMATS AND OFFICIALS

Thirty nine Officer Trainees (OTs) of 2018 batch and two Bhutanese diplomats, who began their training at Foreign Service Institute (FSI) on 10 December 2018, completed their training on 31 May 2019. 

REPRESENTATIONAL GRADE TRAINING

- ➤ A specialized training programme for Commercial Representatives (CRs) from Africa (excluding WANA region) and Americas (including LAC region) was conducted from 08 to 12 April 2019. Twenty six CRs from the above mentioned region participated in the programme at FSI.
- ➤ A one week pre-deployment training programme for the Defence Attachés was organised by FSI, from 10 to 14 June 2019. Fifteen army officials in the rank of Colonel and Brigadier equivalent from the three services of the Indian military (Army, Air force and Navy) participated



Training for Foreign Diplomats

▶ The 1st Annual Disarmament & International Security Affairs Fellowship Programme was organized at FSI from 14 January 2019 to 01 February 2019. The Fellowship Programme was organized in collaboration with the Disarmament & International Security Affairs (D&ISA) Division of the Ministry of External Affairs. Twenty six participants from twenty six different countries, including the P-5 countries (Algeria, Argentina, Austria, Bangladesh, Brazil, China, Colombia, Cuba, France, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Japan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nigeria, Russia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, UK, Venezuela and Vietnam) participated in the Programme. Mr. Vijay Gokhale, Foreign Secretary of India and Ms. Izumi Nakamitsu, UN Under-Secretary General were the keynote speakers at the inaugural-



cum- welcome session. Amb J.S. Mukul, Dean (FSI), Amb Indra Mani Pandey, Additional Secretary (D&ISA) and Ms. Renata Dawn, Director (UNIDIR) also addressed the Fellows during the inauguration.

➤ The 2nd Special Course for diplomats from Syria was organized by FSI from 04 to 16 February 2019. Forty young diplomats from Syria participated in the Course. The delegation was led by Amb Ghassan Nseir, Dean of the Syrian Diplomatic Institute. Amb J.S. Mukul, Dean (FSI) hosted a



welcome reception for the Syrian diplomats which was also attended by H.E. Dr. Riad Kamel Abbas, Ambassador of Syria to India. By way of background, the 1st Special Course for 26 Syrian diplomats was successfully held at the FSI in January 2018. To date, 76 Syrian diplomats have participated in FSI training programmes for foreign diplomats.

➤ FSI organized the 2nd Familiarization Programme for Resident Heads of Mission (HoMs) from 18 to 22 February 2019. Resident HoMs from East, South, Central and West Africa participated in the Programme. Amb T.S. Tirumurti, Secretary (ER) of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and other senior officers from MEA and Government of India addressed



the Resident HoMs during the programme. The 1st Familiarization Programme for Resident HoMs was successfully conducted at FSI on 20-24 August 2018. HoMs from Latin and Caribbean countries had participated in the 1st Programme.

➤ The 2nd Special Course for Sudanese diplomats was organized by FSI from 25 February 2019 to 09 March 2019. Forty-six young diplomats from Sudan participated in the Course. Amb J.S. Mukul, Dean (FSI) hosted a welcome reception for the Sudanese diplomats.



➤ The 67th Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats (PCFD) was organized by FSI from 13 March 2019 to 12 April 2019. Forty eight diplomats from forty two countries participated in the Course. The Course included training modules



on various topics including India's foreign policy, key international issues, multilateral diplomacy and diplomatic skills. The participants got an exposure to modern India's economic and technological developments. The diplomats also undertook study tours to Agra and Jaipur to experience the rich cultural heritage of India. The 1st PCFD was started in the year 1992 and is the flagship Course of FSI for foreign diplomats. It affirms the commitment of India to its friendly countries in sharing the knowledge and expertise in the field of diplomats' training.

➤ The 1st Special Course for diplomats from Morocco was organized by FSI from 15 to 27 April 2019. Fourteen young diplomats from Morocco participated.



➤ The 1st Special Course for diplomats from Senegal was organized by FSI from 15 to 27 April 2019. Ten young diplomats from Senegal participated in the Course, seven diplomats from Senegal had participated in various FSI training programmes.
